

As The Old Man tightens his grip on power, Gabrielle finds herself under increasing pressure to drop the private prosecution. It is against this backdrop that she and Ben suffer a shocking, prolonged attack which sees their lives splinter across continents and their stories diverge, forcing Gabrielle on a painful journey towards self-realisation.
